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Kenji Higashihama is a pianist, music director, and music educator. His career in music began in church, playing piano for services and arranging for vocal ensembles. This experience eventually led to his work in musical theatre as a music director and keyboard programmer. Here in California, he has been fortunate to work with many performing arts organizations such as Lesher Center for the Arts, Berkeley Rep, La Jolla Playhouse, and Piedmont Children's Choirs.

Mark Growden is an American composer, multi-instrumentalist, singer, music educator, conductor, songwriter/poet, visual artist, and mental health advocate/activist. He is the founder and Artistic Director of The Calling All Choir, The Chromatic Community Music Center, SF SingFest, and The SF Jaw Harp Choir in San Francisco, CA. He was the founding Artistic Director of the Marigny Opera House in New Orleans and is the co-founder of the New Orleans Dance Festival. He is mentored by Vance George, Director Emeritus San Francisco Symphony Chorus; is an Alice Parker Composers Workshop Fellow; and has also studied with Michael Kaulkin, Joseph Stillwell, and Remy Charlip. He has released several critically acclaimed albums and has toured internationally. He has composed original musical scores for dozens of dance and theater companies and scored several films. He also has an online, private musicianship studio and often has room for more students. Growden has devoted his life to making music for other people and to helping other people make music for themselves. For more information please visit markgrowden.org.





- The Rain Song SATB, SSAA, & TTBB with body percussion Growden's most-popular piece. Accessible four-part polyphony. Fun and Funky.
- The Patience of Ordinary Things SATB a cappalla A setting of Pat Schneider's lovely poem.
- Noah's Dove SATB chorus (with divisi) A setting of a canon from an unknown
- **Reunion** SATB a cappalla choral arrangement with body percussion. A setting of Bobbie Gentry's classic song. Upbeat and lots of fun.
- Sing it to the Ocean a cappella SSATTB Accessible song with a gospel feel. Can be adapted for unison or two-part singing.
- Floatin' Down the River SAATB chorus and upright bass Downtempo, swampy blues. Can be adapted for developing singers groups.
- Sally SATB chorus, piano, and B flat trumpet A celebratory setting of the English nursery rhyme.
- I Will Wait for You a cappella SATB chorus (with divisi) Soft, slow, pretty, and rich.
- As the River Runs SATB chorus and drum Exotic melodies and harmonies carry this meditative text
- Grandmother Daydreams a cappella SATB chorus You might call this poetic tribute to Growden's grandmothers "post-modern barbershop". Lots of close harmony and lush seventh chords.
- Stillness for a cappella SATB chorus (with divisi) A pandiatonic piece celebrating squiet and stillness.
- *Little Bird* for a cappella SATB chorus A cheerful jaunt with a clever love poem. Can be adapted for developing singers.
