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From the Composer

Five Pieces for Dancing was composed for Kimberly Staley and Choreographed by her at Texas Women's University in February of 1984. This was Mr. Ramsey's second work to be danced under the direction of Ms Staley.

The pieces are inspired by dance forms popular in the Baroque period and earlier. Many composers wrote suites of these dance forms for chamber groups of varying make up and size. Keyboard suites also popularly utilized many of these forms.

The present set does not attempt to provide historical interpretations of these dances, but rather to express something of the rhythm and character of the dances without adhering to their classical forms. They do not simulate baroque characteristics, but offer contemporary music inspired by them.

The Prelude least represents anything resembling early dances. It's purpose is to establish harmonic and melodic materials which are utilized throughout the five pieces. A Nine-tone scale is used in each piece. Small three and four note fragments taken from the scale are combined in various ways to form structures that are used as thematic materials and accompanimental figures.

Titles given the last four pieces reflect something of the sense and energy of their historical namesakes.
