

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
VARIATIONS FOR SOLO VIOLIN

Variations for Solo Violin was written in 1988 for violinist/violist Christian Colberg, who premiered the work on recitals in Baltimore, Maryland and San Juan, Puerto Rico. The variations are composed not as a set of classical thematic variations, but rather studies in different moods linked to the harmonic underpinning of the opening theme, and infused with fragments and musical reminiscences derived from its melodic material.

Notation and Performance Considerations

The variations are unmeasured, although a double barline is given at the end of each variation. Accidentals, therefore apply only to the notes which they immediately precede. Nonetheless, cautionary naturals have been added throughout the piece, in order to facilitate reading and to clarify some passages which might seem otherwise ambiguous. Throughout the piece there are many luftpause markings to delineate phrase endings. These should be interpreted as short rests or breaths which the performer is at liberty to make longer or shorter, depending on what seems appropriate for the musical phrasing.

Although this work is intended for professional violinists, it may also be appropriate for advanced student performers.
